Pre-Anesthetic Blood Testing Consent Form

Please read carefully and sign.

Like you, our greatest concern is the wellbeing of your pet. Your pet is scheduled for anesthesia and/or surgery. Before putting your pet under anesthesia, we will perform a full physical examination. We also recommend that a pre-anesthetic blood profile be performed to maximize patient safety and alert the doctor to the presence of dehydration, anemia, infection, diabetes and/or kidney or liver disease which could complicate the procedure. These conditions may not be detected without a pre-anesthetic profile. These tests are similar to those your own physician would run if you were to undergo anesthesia. In addition, the results of these tests may be useful if your pet's health changes to develop faster, more accurate diagnoses and treatments.

VACCINES – All pets **must** be current on **rabies** vaccine. If your pet is not current it **must** receive a rabies vaccine, **no exceptions**.

The cost for the 1 year vaccine is **\$20.95**. If your pet has **never** received a rabies vaccine, it **MUST** get the 1 year.

The cost for the 3 year vaccine is **\$42.95**. Your pet may receive this **if** it was vaccinated last year (with proof).

If your pet **does not** need a rabies, we **require proof of vaccination**.

In order to fully protect your pet against preventable diseases, it is **highly recommended** that all **dogs** receive a distemper/parvo and a bordetella vaccine and all **cats** receive a distemper vaccine. **Parvo is very deadly and expensive to treat!** Cost is **\$24.95** each.

PARASITE TESTING DOGS AND CATS! Intestinal parasites (Hookworms, roundworms, whipworms, coccidia, giardia) can be transmissible to humans and can increase your pet's surgical risk. May we check your pet for intestinal parasites?

The cost is **\$25.95**.

HEARTWORM TESTING DOGS ONLY! It is **highly recommended** that all **dogs** over 6 months of age be tested and found negative for heartworms within the past 12 months. The cost is **\$45.95**. May we test your dog for heartworms?

FELV/FIV TESTING – CATS ONLY! Feline leukemia virus and feline immunodeficiency virus are potentially deadly diseases in cats. Kittens can contract the disease(s) from their mother during gestation and adult cats can become infected through contact with positive cats. It is possible for a positive cat to appear healthy for years. A simple in-house blood test will identify if your cat is positive. May we test your cat? The cost is **\$54.50**.

If your cat tests negative, may we vaccinate for leukemia? The vaccine is 99.9% effective in preventing the disease. A booster will be required in 3 weeks and then once yearly. The cost is **\$31.95 each**.

PAIN RELIEF - It has been shown that the relief of pain helps speed recovery, aids healing and that animals feel pain just as we do.

Every pet is given pain medication prior to surgery. This will help control pain for 24 hours. **Additional** pain medication is sometimes needed, and **REQUIRED**, at owner's expense, in some procedures. For optional procedures, if your pet shows signs of pain may we give additional pain medication? The cost is **\$39.00 to \$65.00 (varies on size of pet)**.

MICROCHIPPING – A microchip provides lifelong permanent ID in the case of loss or theft of your pet. This is easily done at any time but painless while under anesthesia. The cost **includes** the microchip and the fee to register your pet for life with the global recovery network. No additional fees ever. May we help with permanent ID of your pet by placing a microchip today? Our staff even does all the paperwork for you! The cost is only **\$51.50**.

ELIZABETHAN COLLARS - It is very important after any surgery that your pet not lick, bite or chew at the surgery area. Some pets will need an E-collar fitted for them to keep them from chewing, biting, licking. Would you like us to fit your pet with an E-collar prior to discharge? DENTAL PROCEDURES

You have been given two other papers concerning bloodwork, vaccines, parasite status, anesthesia and pain control. Please read all pages and answer all questions. This is a supplement sheet concerning dental patients only.

The dental cleaning includes ultrasonic scaling, polishing, antibiotic injection and an oral exam. We examine the teeth and gums for gingivitis, tumors, pockets, loose teeth, infected teeth, fractures, cavities and bone loss. Often the veterinarian and the owner are unaware of problems until after the teeth are cleaned and the mouth thoroughly examined.

Loose teeth, infected teeth, and/or damaged teeth typically need to be extracted. Leaving these teeth in the mouth sets your pet up for potential further problems such as infections, abscesses, and heart and kidney disease. The cost of extraction(s) varies based on what size tooth and how difficult it is to extract. Extractions generally cost between \$25.00 and \$150.00 total in addition to the dental cost. Additional antibiotics and pain medicine to give at home may also be needed if teeth are extracted. The costs of these varies based on the pet's weight, but is generally between \$20.00 and \$60.00 total. **Please read carefully and check ONE of the following options.**

- _____ Perform any extractions or periodontal surgery necessary. Any loose, infected or damaged teeth will be extracted at the doctor's discretion. Please note that we never remove healthy teeth. Any extractions performed will be only on teeth that have abnormalities.
- _____ Call me first, but if you cannot reach me by telephone, you may proceed with any procedure(s) deemed medically necessary. Remember your pet will be under general anesthesia and we cannot delay procedures if we are unable to reach you.
- _____ Do nothing unless you reach me by telephone. I understand that you will wake my pet up without doing even the simplest of additional procedure(s). I also understand that should I agree to the recommended procedure(s) at a later date, there will be additional charges for the anesthetic and procedure(s).

Oravet plaque prevention

Oravet is a barrier sealant that helps to protect teeth and gums from plaque and calculus buildup due to bacteria. This can help extend the time between dental cleanings, help keep your pet's teeth and gums healthy and help control bad breath.

The first application is done here just after the dental cleaning. You are then sent home with a take home kit. You must apply a coat of sealant once weekly. It is simple to apply and takes less than 60 seconds. You simply spread the gel along your pet's gum line using the applicator supplied. The take home kit lasts 8 weeks for large dogs and up to 24 weeks for small dogs and cats. The cost which includes the take home kit and the first application which we do is \$45.00. Additional take home kits are \$38.00. May we apply oravet and supply you with the take home kit?
