Pre-Anesthetic Blood Testing Consent Form

Please read carefully and sign.

Like you, our greatest concern is the wellbeing of your pet. Your pet is scheduled for anesthesia and/or surgery. Before putting your pet under anesthesia, we will perform a full physical examination. We also recommend that a pre-anesthetic blood profile be performed to maximize patient safety and alert the doctor to the presence of dehydration, anemia, infection, diabetes and/or kidney or liver disease which could complicate the procedure. These conditions may not be detected without a pre-anesthetic profile. These tests are similar to those your own physician would run if you were to undergo anesthesia. In addition, the results of these tests may be useful if your pet's health changes to develop faster, more accurate diagnoses and treatments.

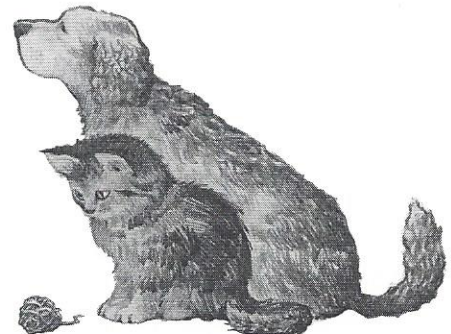

I understand that there is some inherent risk associated with any anesthetic procedure. I understand that the doctors and staff at Family Pet Care will use all reasonable precautions against injury, escape, or death of my pet. I hereby and by the presents forever release the said doctor, his/her agents, staff, or representatives from any and all liability arising from said surgery on said animal.

VACCINES – All pets must be current on rabies vaccine. If your pet is not current it must receive a rabies vaccine, no exceptions.

The cost for the 1 year vaccine is **\$20.95**. If your pet has never received a rabies vaccine, it MUST get the 1 year.

The cost for the 3 year vaccine is **\$42.95**. Your pet may receive this if it was vaccinated last year (with proof).

If your pet **does not** need a rabies, **we require proof of vaccination**.

In order to fully protect your pet against preventable diseases, it is highly recommended that all dogs receive a distemper/parvo and a bordetella vaccine and all cats receive a distemper vaccine. **Parvo is very deadly and expensive to treat!** Cost is **\$24.95** each.

PARASITE TESTING DOGS AND CATS! Intestinal parasites (Hookworms, roundworms, whipworms, coccidia, giardia) can be transmissible to humans and can increase your pet's surgical risk. May we check your pet for intestinal parasites?

The cost is **\$25.95**. YES NO

HEARTWORM TESTING DOGS ONLY! It is highly recommended that all dogs over 6 months of age be tested and found negative for heartworms within the past 12 months. The cost is **\$45.95**. May we test your dog for heartworms? YES NO

FELV/FIV TESTING – CATS ONLY! Feline leukemia virus and feline immunodeficiency virus are potentially deadly diseases in cats. Kittens can contract the disease(s) from their mother during gestation and adult cats can become infected through contact with positive cats. It is possible for a positive cat to appear healthy for years. A simple in-house blood test will identify if your cat is positive. May we test your cat? The cost is **\$54.50**. YES NO

If your cat tests negative, may we vaccinate for leukemia? The vaccine is 99.9% effective in preventing the disease. A booster will be required in 3 weeks and then once yearly. The cost is **\$31.95 each**.

PAIN RELIEF – It has been shown that the relief of pain helps speed recovery, aids healing and that animals feel pain just as we do. **Every** pet is given pain medication prior to surgery. This will help control pain for 24 hours. **Additional** pain medication is sometimes needed, and **REQUIRED**, at owner's expense, in some procedures. For optional procedures, if your pet shows signs of pain may we give additional pain medication? The cost is **\$39.00 to \$65.00 (varies on size of pet)**. YES NO

MICROCHIPPING – A microchip provides lifelong permanent ID in the case of loss or theft of your pet. This is easily done at any time but painless while under anesthesia. The cost includes the microchip and the fee to register your pet for life with the global recovery network. No additional fees ever. May we help with permanent ID of your pet by placing a microchip today? Our staff even does all the paperwork for you! The cost is only **\$51.50**. YES NO

ELIZABETHAN COLLARS – It is very important after any surgery that your pet not lick, bite or chew at the surgery area. Some pets will need an E-collar fitted for them to keep them from chewing, biting, licking. Would you like us to fit your pet with an E-collar prior to discharge? Cost is **\$13.00 to \$27.00 depending on the size of your pet**. YES NO

FAMILY PET CARE**LASER SURGERY RELEASE FORM**

As part of our commitment to quality care, we are pleased to offer laser surgery as an option for safe, comfortable treatment for your pet. We feel that laser surgery provides the best possible care for your pet.

The benefits of laser surgery are:

Less Pain – The laser seals nerve endings as it “cuts”, so your pet may require fewer anesthetics during the operation, also reducing pain after the surgery. This is especially true for declaw surgeries in cats.

Less Bleeding – The laser seals small blood vessels during the surgery, greatly reducing blood loss. Because there is less bleeding, surgery is often completed more quickly, reducing the amount of time your pet will be under anesthesia. This further reduces potential complications. The laser procedure is very beneficial during more complex surgeries such as spays and mass removals.

Less Swelling and Infection – The laser energy does not crush, tear or bruise the tissue because there is no physical contact with the tissue. This decreases the recovery time for your pet, which shortens hospital stays. Additionally, the CO2 laser energy acts as an antimicrobial/antibacterial agent by producing high temperatures, effectively eliminating microorganisms.

Your pet will be treated with the utmost care using the latest state of the art CO2 Surgical Laser available in Veterinary Medicine. The laser produces an invisible beam of light that can remove a precise layer of tissue at one time. This can reduce your pet's post operative recovery time, leading to a quicker return to normal activities.

I understand that laser surgery is an option and I have been advised of the advantages the procedure will offer.

The costs listed below are in addition to normal surgery costs:

- Level I: \$75 (spays, neuters, minor skin lesions such as warts)
- Level II: \$140 (larger tumor removals, mammary tumors, soft palates, amputations, etc.)
